The **CHARGE** of the NDSU VDL is to conduct diagnosis of farm and domestic animals and poultry suspected of having diseases and report the findings as directed (Century Code section 15-12-20). Additionally, the NDSU VDL performs rabies tests as required by Century Code section 23-36-03. The **MISSION** of the VDL is to provide reliable testing and diagnostic support services to veterinarians, animal owners, producers, and the public health sector.

NDSU VDL supports Agriculture

- Animal health testing and diagnostic services to determine the cause of disease and death loss
- Foreign animal disease testing and surveillance as a member of the USDA National Animal Health Laboratory Network
- Specialized testing for mycotoxins, pesticides, phytoestrogens, blister beetle toxin (cantharidin) and petroleum compounds

NDSU VDL protects Communities

- Testing for diseases of public health importance such as rabies, anthrax, tularemia, fungal infections, and West Nile virus
- Member of the FDA Vet-LIRN antimicrobial resistance testing and surveillance network
- Capability to conduct overflow testing for ND DHHS during outbreaks of select agents and other infectious diseases

NDSU VDL Challenges

- Rising costs of salaries, reagents, supplies, and equipment
- Service and preventative maintenance for current equipment >\$150K per year
- Loss of staff positions due to decreased NDAES budget
- Technician shortages for pathology and toxicology investigations, and during foreign animal disease outbreaks
- Difficulty recruiting veterinary specialists

SBARE Request

- Long-term sustainable funding for personnel, supplies, equipment, and maintenance
- Increase NDAES operating budget
